



RYA Cymru.Wales WELSH ZONE CHAMPIONSHIPS Cardiff Bay Yacht Club 24th & 25th SEPTEMBER 2016 NOTICE OF RACE

The 2016 RYA Cymru. Wales Welsh Zone Championships will be held at Cardiff Bay YachtClub on the 24th and 25th September 2016. The Organising Authority is the Royal Yachting Association Cymru. Wales (RYACW) in conjunction with Cardiff Bay Yacht Club.

1. RULES

1.1 Racing will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (2013-17)*. Competitors should note that RYACW events will be run in compliance with the principles of the RYA Racing Charter as applicable to both organisers and competitors, details of which can be found at the front of the RYA rule book (Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2017), or at www.rya.org.uk/racing/charter.

2. ADVERTISING

2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 Racing will be for nominated dinghy and windsurfer classes. Fleets may be combined in the event of low entries. Fleets with entries of fewer than 5 boats by the closing date will be reviewed.
- 3.2 The classes will include Optimists, Toppers and General Handicap. (RYA National Class rules apply). There will also be Regatta Optimists, Regatta Toppers and Regatta General Handicap. Windsurfers will complete in 4 classes within one fleet.
- 3.3 Competitors in junior classes (Optimist, Topper, RS Feva) shall be 16 or under on 31 December 2015. Competitors in youth classes (Laser, Laser Radial, 420 and 29er) shall be under 19 on 31 December 2015.
- 3.4 Entries will only be accepted via the event on-line entry form www.welshsailingevents.org, and shall be received, together with the entry fee, on or before 22nd September 2016. Thereafter, entries will be accepted on the day.
- 3.5 Regatta fleet racing at the RYACW Welsh Home Zone Championships is open to less experienced club sailors in Optimists, Toppers (including 4.2 sailors) and RS Teras and Fevas. The racing will be organised by coaches and run on an informal basis, starting at around the same time as the main fleets, on both days.
 The coaches will brief the regatta fleet sailors on the format for the day, immediately after the main competitor briefing on Saturday.

3.6 All helms and crews are required to present a signed Entry/Parent/Guardian Declaration at registration. (Competitors will receive this by email when they complete entry www.welshsailingevents.org and bring it with you).

Medical forms as part of the on-line entry are required to be completed for all competitors. Data Protection Act: This is a safety requirement and no data on this will be retained after the event

4. FEES

The entry fees are as follows:

Double-hander £48.00 Single-hander £40.00

5. SCHEDULE

5.1 **Registration**

Competitors shall register at the Event Office on Friday 23rd September from 16:30–19:30 and Saturday 24th September from 08:30 –10:00. There will be a competitor briefing at 10:30.

5.2 Measurement:

Class measurement certificates may be required at registration.

5.3 Racing Programme:

The detailed programme will be published in the Sailing Instructions. The warning signal for the first race on Saturday 24th September not before 11:55. The Race Committee will endeavour to complete the Championship by mid-afternoon on Sunday.

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 6.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available for all competitors at registration at the venue.
- 6.2 Draft sailing instructions will be available on/before the event website from 21st September 2015

Please note that these are DRAFT and may be subject to change. Questions on the Notice of Race or Sailing Instructions may be emailed to paul.simes@ryacymruwales.org.uk . These together with answers will be posted on the event website.

7. VENUE

Races will be sailed in the confined waters of Cardiff Bay for dinghies/windsurfers and possibly the Severn Estuary for windsurfers depending on the weather.

8. THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be windward/leeward and/or trapezoid. The courses to be sailed for each class will be detailed in the Sailing Instructions.

9. PROTESTS

The Exoneration Penalty and the Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will be available.

10. SCORING

The scoring system will be detailed in the sailing instructions.

11. SUPPORT BOATS

Except when requested by or agreed with the race committee, coaches and supporters may not communicate with competitors' afloat, tow competitors to or from the race area, or enter the race area.

12. BERTHING

Boats shall be kept in their assigned spaces in the boat park.

13. RADIO COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction includes mobile telephones.

14. RIGHTS TO USE NAMES AND LIKENESSES

Competitors automatically grant to the organising authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the event.

15. SAFETY REGULATIONS

All competitors shall wear a personal flotation device at all times when afloat, except briefly when changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Wet suits and dry suits are not considered personal flotation devices. This changes rule 40.1

16. LIABILITY

Risk Statement

- 16.1 RRS Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."
- Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
- 16.3 They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- 16.4 They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;

- 16.5 They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omission;
- 16.6 Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- 16.7 The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- 16.8 The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;

17. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £2 million per event or the equivalent.
